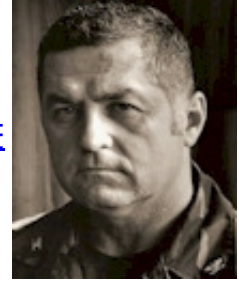

Remembering Our Roots

The Veterans Memorial Foundation of Berlin, WI and The Future Farmers of America Crop Research Project!!

When Admiral Carey was growing up as a boy in Berlin, WI, he was always impressed with the large number of military veterans that his hometown seemed to produce. After forming this foundation, he decided to check into it and discovered that his hometown in fact produced a higher percentage of veterans than much of the outlying area, including his Father and an Uncle who both fought in France in World War I, both of his brothers who served in the U. S. Navy, and his Great Grandfather and two Great Uncles, all 3 of whom were in the Union Army in the Civil War. So when he learned that some of the veterans of Berlin, WI were forming a Veterans Memorial Foundation to build and maintain a memorial to these patriots, he immediately wanted to be involved. All this led to



a recent agreement with his hometown veterans memorial foundation for this foundation to endow them in perpetuity, with 50% of the endowment to be used for the upkeep and maintenance of ALL the veterans memorials in the city and the other half to be used for research and publication on the memorial website of the histories and stories of all these patriots so that the citizens of the area would always remember the sacrifice of these fine men and women who answered their nation's call thus ensuring that all of us would live in freedom. Another hometown program of the Admiral Carey Foundation relates to a crop research project with the local chapter of the Future Farmers of America at Berlin High School. Admiral Carey owns an 8 acre tract of land along the banks of the Fox River about 2 miles East of Berlin, and he provides that land "on loan" for the FFA to plant experimental crops and improve experimental crop tillage innovations. Recently the FFA Chapter erected a sign on the land so the local residents would know how the land is being put to good use for the benefit of everyone who engages in agriculture.
